You too can be an instant expert!

When you play the public speaking game "Expert Interviews" you become an expert, no matter the topic. You know it all!

This is an invitation to suspend truth, embellish reality and immerse yourself, your friends and family, in fun.



Game overview

"Expert Interviews" is a paired impromptu speaking game. One person takes

on the role of expert, and the other becomes the interviewer. The name of the expert and their area of expertise is randomly drawn by interviewer. It could be any one of the 100 expert names and interview ideas that you'll find if you scroll down past the instructions for playing the game. The expert learns both his/her name and their area of expertise from the interviewer's introduction.

For example:

"We're extremely fortunate today to have with us in the studio, **Isaac**Flugelhorn. Isaac is a well-known, respected and published expert on the benefits of teaching children to read underwater. Isaac, I'd like to begin to by asking when you first realized your vocation?"

The game ends when the interviewer brings it to a close after approximately 2 minutes of Question & Answer.

The aim of the game

Aside from being very entertaining there are useful goals for the players to reach for.

For the expert

The goal for the expert is to 'own' their given area of expertise realistically and wholeheartedly, regardless of how ridiculous the topic is or how little knowledge they have on the subject.

For the interviewer

The goal for the interviewer is to draw out the expert by asking open-ended questions.

Who can play?

You need a minimum of 2 people, and the game is best suited to those over 12 years old. I've used it with adults, and mixed groups of adults and children. It's been a hit every time – one those games that people ask for again, and again.

What will this game help develop?

- impromptu speaking the ability to think, then speak fluently, with ease
- an awareness of the elements of entertaining storytelling
- · the ability to ask good open ended questions
- imaginative, creative thinking
- all the aspects of vocal variety pace, pause, pitch, volume, fluency
- · use of body language
- · confidence
- trust in oneself that you can think, and that you can answer appropriately and well
- audience awareness the ability to gauge when to change direction if the audience is not responding well, or when to finish the interview ...

How to play

- 1. Print off the number of expert names needed. Place them face down.
- 2. The players pair up and decide who is the interviewer and who is the expert.

- 3. The pairs decide the order they are going to follow.
- 4. The interviewer selects a name/topic and begins.
- 5. When all the pairs have had their turns, switch roles and start again.
 This gives everyone an opportunity to experience being the expert and the interviewer.

Rules

There are very few!

- 1. Once a name/topic has been used put it aside to ensure it doesn't get picked again.
- 2. A name/topic can not be exchanged. Players must use what was selected.
- 3. Agree to keep the interviews to around 2 3 minutes long to keep the game moving along.
- 4. The audience, (namely the pairs who are listening and watching while waiting for their turn), must be positive and supportive.
